- Qualification: Earned Master's in Geology or related field from an accredited college or university required. Undergraduate-level laboratory teaching experience is preferred. Applicants should be able to communicate and teach effectively in English.
- Responsibilities: The primary teaching responsibility includes the laboratory instruction for introductory-level physical and environmental geology.
- Salary: Commensurate with qualifications and experience.
- The Department: The Department of Agriculture, Geosciences, and Natural Resources at UT Martin offers Bachelor of Science degree programs in Agriculture, Geosciences, and Natural Resources Management.
