MI 48201 Anthony Flaccavento owns and manages a 7 ½ acre farm in Abingdon, Virginia, where he grows and sells over 50 different types of vegetables and fruits through a farmers market, to restaurants and through a grower network. He has been working on community environmental and economic development in the region and around the nation for the past 28 years. He has led workshops, and provided trainings and technical assistance to hundreds of farmers, in more than a dozen states, focusing on intensive organic production, soil fertility, season extension, organic pest and disease control, and farm planning and management.

In 1995, he founded Appalachian Sustainable Development (ASD), which became a regional and national leader in sustainable economic development. During his tenure, ASD launched innovative enterprises in food aggregation and distribution, food access for lower income people, sustainable forestry and wood products, school-based gardens and outdoor classrooms, and much more. ASD's *Appalachian Harvest*, launched in 1999, was one of the first community food hubs in the nation. Anthony left ASD in 2009 to found SCALE, Inc, a private consulting business dedicated to catalyzing and supporting ecologically healthy regional economies and food systems.
