THE DETAILS

Apprenticeships run from late April through October.

20 hours/week includes a mix of instruction, farm work, market experience, and field trips.

Schedule is 8am-noon, Tuesday through Friday, with a rotating schedule of markets either Wednesday, 1pm-8pm or Saturday 9am-3pm with some weekend work.

Apprentices receive a stipend of \$3000 over the course of the apprenticeship.

Apprenticeships are open to all Lansing-area residents, and we especially encourage applications from those who live in the Urbandale Neighborhood.
