Transformation of Asia Pacific Management Research

Asia Academy of Management (AAOM) will host a regional symposium on Aug 26 – 27 at the Curtin Business School-Perth, Australia on the theme of "Transformation of Asia Pacific Management Research".

The rise of companies from Asia pacific region into the global stage has led to the substantial attention from researchers to understand the management practices of these firms. Studies have already indentified several distinctive aspects of Asia pacific management such as the prevalence of business groups as a dominant form of organization, role of family and government in management, importance of personal relationships (e.g. Quanxi) and resource constrained innovation (e.g. Juggad) to enrich the existing theories in strategy and management literature. This symposium intends to advance this tradition by focusing on the important contribution of Asia pacific management research. We invite research papers addressing the unique aspects of management of companies based in Asia pacific region which can advance our theoretical understanding of a particular management phenomenon. While there is substantial emphasis in existing literature on the distinctiveness between Asia pacific companies as compared to their western counterparts, we encourage scholars to focus on the distinctiveness within Asia pacific economies and their implications. The papers can address any field of management such as human resource management, strategic management, international business and organization theory and behaviour etc.

APJM Paper Development Workshop

The symposium will also include a paper development workshop, which will be led by Jane Lu, Editor-in-Chief of APJM and other distinguished panellists including the senior editors of APJM. A separate call will be announced with details of the PDW.

The purpose of the PDW is to provide feedback to junior scholars and doctoral students on their research projects that are in advanced stage of development. Consistent with the mission of the Asia Academy of Management, our objective is to encourage scholars to do quality research on issues that are of relevance to the Asia Pacific region. While we certainly hope that the authors will develop their work and submit to APJM, there is no obligation to do so.

Submission Instructions

We encourage authors to submit their original work for symposium under two categories

- full length papers: Completed papers with a word length of not more than 10,000 words in length which the authors are considering for journal submission
- -idea papers (abstract): Papers in their development stage with a word length of not more than 2500 words which the authors considering to develop further for journal submission.

The deadline for submission is June 30th, 2016. Papers will be reviewed and the final decisions will be conveyed to the authors by July 15th, 2016.
