We strongly prefer candidates at the Assistant Professor level, though qualified candidates at the Associate Professor level will also be considered. Candidates at the Assistant Professor level must be ABD or have completed a doctorate and must demonstrate a strong commitment to high quality research and teaching. Candidates at the Associate Professor level must have a demonstrated track record of successful research, teaching, and service.
