Conservation Internship



The Potter Park Zoo Education Department is offering a limited number of unpaid full-time (40 hours) and part-time (20+ hours) internships. The Conservation Internship provides participants the opportunity for practical learning and hands-on experience relating to conservation in a zoological setting. Duties and tasks may include but are not limited to:

- 1. Researching and developing new conservation education programming, new conservation projects, zoo graphics, blogs, animal fact sheets, and guest interactions.
- 2. Assisting staff with the maintenance of native vegetation around the zoo including the native pollinator garden.
- 3. Conduct and analyze surveys relating to conservation programming and visitor awareness.
- 4. Create interactive activities to be used with programming or to engage visitors with the zoo's conservation messaging.
- 5. Interns will be required to complete a special interest project during their internship.

Requirements

- 1. Students who are currently pursuing or have recently completed a degree in zoology, fisheries and wildlife, animal science, biology, environmental education, or related field.
- 2. Must be in good physical condition, able to lift up to 40lbs, and provide proof of a negative TB test and tetanus vaccination (within the last 10 years) within 2 weeks of starting.
- 3. Have excellent communication skills and must be self-motivated, energetic, adaptable, and able to work on a team.

Further Comments

- 1. Hours will generally be during the week, with some required weekend and evening special events/programs.
- 2. This is an unpaid internship. College credit is available; the intern is responsible for obtaining the necessary paperwork and approval from their university.
- 3. Interns are also encouraged, but not required, to take the spring Docent Class. If accepted for an internship, more information regarding the class will be provided.
