- Advanced technical skills in database management, statistics, and GIS
- Strong communication and teamwork skills
- Ability to cultivate partnerships with groups having diverse interests

You will be responsible for inventory, monitoring, and applied research of mammals with emphasis on Kodiak brown bear on the 1.9-million acre Refuge. Priority management concerns include: sufficiency of current methods of bear population monitoring; exposure of bears to environmental contaminants; influence of non-native herbivores on bear habitat quality; requirements of bears for salmon; and shifting of annual activity schedules of bears associated with shifting phenology of food resources.
