Detroit River International Wildlife Refuge

Come join the biological team at the Detroit River International Wildlife Refuge!

Detroit River IWR is looking to hire a full-time, six-month biological science invasive species technician from May through October 2022. Projects during this term may include early detection surveys for invasive plant species, prioritized treatment on Refuge lands, water level management in impounded wetlands, targeted invasive species outreach and collaboration with partners, and assisting the Refuge Biologist with other projects as needed.

Established in 2001, Detroit River IWR has grown to over 6,000 acres managed including cooperative agreements. The Refuge is the only International Wildlife Refuge in the United States and is one of the few Urban Wildlife Refuges in the country. The Refuge protects islands, shoals, coastal wetlands, and grasslands along western Lake Erie and the Detroit River.
