Job Purpose

The University of Edinburgh Business School is seeking to appoint a Lecturer or Senior Lecturer to its Strategy Group. We are seeking high quality candidates to teach and research in areas broadly related to international management. The successful applicant will contribute to the objectives of the Business School by engaging in research and teaching of the highest quality, and publishing in leading international journals. Depending on their specific areas of expertise, the successful candidate will be expected to teach on the School's undergraduate International Business degree, MSc in Global Strategy & Sustainability, MBA and Undergraduate Programmes. From time to time, members of academic staff may be asked to take on managerial and administrative duties, such as leadership of teaching programmes. This is a full-time, open-ended appointment.

Main responsibilities

Responsibilities are set annually by the Head of Group in consultation with the member of staff in the Group. They can be expected to range across the following categories:

- Maintain and continue to pursue an active research programme with an emphasis on international excellence and publication in high-quality journals (25%)
- Apply for research funding (10%)
- Sustain other research-related contributions through conference papers and presentations, dissemination activities and/or consultancy projects and advice. (10%)
- Teach on and, where appropriate, develop and lead programmes under the direction of the Head of the Strategy Group and Head of the Business School (25%)
- Play a significant part in engaging confidently and competently with the world of practice, including potentially teaching on Executive Education courses (15%)

- Undertake reasonable leadership/administrative/managerial duties within the School under the direction of the Head of School and/or Head of Group and play a full part in the intellectual life of the School (10%)
- There will also be an expectation of the ability to cultivate good personal relationships with academic and professional services colleagues (5%)

Planning & Organising

The post holder will be expected to:

- 1. Organise and carry out their work supervised by their line manager.
- 2. Effectively assess resource requirements to deliver teaching and research activities
- 3. Motivate, inspire and support students and colleagues
- 4. Devise and/or manage multiple teaching, learning and assessment activities.

Problem Solving

The post holder will be expected to:

- Apply knowledge and experience to maintain an excellent portfolio of research
- Motivate and inspire students by delivering excellent research-led teaching
- Provide guidance and advice to students as appropriate

Decision Making

The post holder will be expected to:

- Devise an individual programme of research with identifiable outputs in the form of high quality publications, grant income and impact
- Design teaching materials and assessments for courses at all levels
- Contribute to Group decisions on programme development and collaborative research projects

The Strategy Group consists of 18 full-time and 2 part-time faculty that regularly publish in leading journals that include, among others, *Academy of Management Journal, Academy of Management Review, Administrative Science Quarterly, Human Relations, Journal of Management Studies, Journal of World Business, Organization Science*, and *Organization Studies*. Group members also hold editorial and editorial board appointments with several top journals.

Our work is published across a number of areas that can be broadly captured by the following themes: Strategic change and leadership, Organisations and society, Global and international strategies, Creative industries, and Service management (see here: https://www.business-school.ed.ac.uk/research/areas/strategy). There is a strong tradition of collaborative working to help colleagues with research and teaching outputs.

Many of our Group members have developed extensive links with organizations in the private, public and voluntary sectors. These often lead to sponsored research and various forms of Executive Education.

The Group supports a strong group of PhD students and runs high quality courses and degree programmes for undergraduate, MSc and MBA students. With the increasing demands for developing strategy skills and embedding such skills across the curriculum, the Group has been expanding its teaching portfolio with courses for students studying in the Business School as well as elsewhere within the University.
