<u>Professor Jennifer Oetzel's</u> research and teaching focuses on social, economic and environmental sustainability. PAPER PRESENTATIONS & PANELS. Please submit your **1000 word abstract** (not a full paper) of your international business research in-progress or panel proposal for the Research Symposium.

PAPER DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOP. Please submit your paper of **not more than 30 pages double spaced**. Include contact details of all authors. Full papers are desirable but not essential as early stage ideas with a clear conceptual development and framing are also welcome.
