GENERAL DESCRIPTION:

Under the direct supervision of the Area Manager/Assistant Area Manager, the Intern is responsible for assisting staff in all facets of operations on the Justin Hurst Wildlife Management Area (WMA). Field work will be associated with banding activities for mottled ducks and doves, including rocket netting, airboat capture, live trapping, and data entry. Assists with vegetation management activities including, but not limited to, maintenance of wetland management infrastructure, noxious vegetation control and brush management, and monitoring wetland habitat projects. May provide support with alligator spotlight surveys, vegetation surveys and data entry, and other tasks as assigned. Assists WMA staff in installation of WMA markers and signs, maintenance of equipment, facilities, buildings, and public use facilities. Performs work activities at night and under harsh field conditions in hot and humid climate with biting Performs additional duties as assigned. Complies with all insects. Agency, Division and Branch rules, regulations and procedures.

Required to walk and work in soft unstable soils;


