The European International Business Academy (EIBA), in collaboration with IBR (International Business Review) and JAMI (Journée d'Automne du Management International), is organizing an EIBA-Workshop on 'How to craft an IB paper' at the GRM-lab, IAE Nice, Université Côte d'Azur, France.

This workshop is part of the JAMI series (and organized as the 4th 'Journée d'Automne du Management International'), which aims to bring together doctoral students and junior and senior scholars in International Business in the South of France. The EIBA-W is open to all scholars from around Europe and the world, particularly targeting early-career IB scholars.

The EIBA-W is organized as a workshop that helps craft and develop academic papers and includes feedback from renowned scholars and editors in International Business. The objective is to provide doctoral students and junior IB scholars the opportunity to craft academic papers, discuss working papers with senior IB scholars, and gain advice from journal editors. All sessions are interactive, and participants will receive constructive feedback to help develop their papers for IB conference and journal submissions.

We particularly invite doctoral students and junior IB scholars to submit working paper proposals to the EIBA-W. Participants without submissions are also welcome. All participants will benefit from helpful guidance provided by senior IB scholars and journal editors as well as networking opportunities.

Working paper proposals (both conceptual and empirical papers are welcome) should be submitted in English (6,000-12,000 words, including references; double-spaced and in PDF format) by June 15, 2023, on the platform: https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/C9C3H5G



Roger STRANGE is Professor of International Business at the University of Sussex Business School, United Kingdom. His research focuses on four main areas of International Business: the reasons for the outsourcing of primary activities and the externalization of production in global value chains (GVCs); the effects of corporate governance factors on foreign direct investment (FDI) decisions; the determinants of MNE subsidiary location; and the impact of new digital technologies on international business theory and practice. Roger is currently the co-Editor-in-Chief of *International Business Review*. He is also a member of the Editorial Review Boards of the *Journal of International Business Studies, Journal of International Business Policy, Journal of World Business, Global Strategy Journal, Journal of Management & Governance, and Asia Pacific Business Review. He is a Fellow of both the Academy of International Business (AIB) and the European International Business Academy (EIBA). He is a former President of EIBA.*

The EIBA-W will take place at IAE Nice, Université Côte d'Azur, Campus Saint-Jean d'Angély, 5 rue du 22ème B.C.A., 06300 Nice.

The best way to get from the airport or train station to the city-center or university is to take the tram (tickets can be bought at the tram station).

Access from airport to university: Tram Line T2 (direction: 'Port Lympia') from 'Aéroport' to 'Jean Médecin' station, then Line T1 from 'Jean Médecin' station to 'Saint-Jean d'Angély Université' station.
