Assistant or Associate Professor of Entrepreneurship Position Description

DOMINICAN UNIVERSITY's Brennan School of Business announces a search for a tenure-track Assistant or Associate Professor of Entrepreneurship, effective January 2024. The successful candidate will demonstrate a strong commitment to excellence in teaching to a diverse student body in the area of entrepreneurship. The preferred candidate will demonstrate a commitment to the university mission as well as to developing and sustaining a portfolio of intellectual contributions in the field of entrepreneurship. The standard teaching load for this position is 21 credit hours, which corresponds to seven courses during the academic year.

As a Sinsinawa Dominican-sponsored institution, in the Catholic intellectual tradition, Dominican University's mission is to prepare students to pursue truth, to give compassionate service, and to participate in the creation of a more just and humane world. Designated as a Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI), Dominican is a distinctively relationship-centered educational community known for its rigorous and engaging academic programs; for the care and respect with which it mentors students; for its enduring commitment to social justice; and for the enriching diversity of its students, faculty and staff.

Fully accredited by AACSB-International, the Brennan School of Business enrolls 367 undergraduate business majors, and approximately 100 graduate business students within the Master of Business Administration (MBA), the Master of Science in Accounting (MSA), and the Master of Science in Health Care Management (MSHCM) Programs. Qualifications:

Required Qualifications

Candidates must have a PhD in Entrepreneurship/Management from an AACSB accredited institution, teaching experience, and/or relevant professional experience. Candidates with an interest in social entrepreneurship and international entrepreneurship are particularly encouraged to apply. Highly qualified ABD candidates who will complete their degree by January 2024 will also be considered.

Preferred Qualifications

A background in creating and implementing experiential learning projects in entrepreneurship is preferred, but candidates with all backgrounds will be considered. Experience teaching students from diverse populations and demonstrated experience creating or leading entrepreneurship programs or social entrepreneurship programs is preferred.

To Apply:

Applicants will submit a (1) cover letter, (2) curriculum vitae, (3) statement of teaching philosophy, (4) a sample of intellectual contributions, and (5) the names and contact information of 3 references. The cover letter should address work and other opportunities they have had to interact and serve in high needs and diverse populations and other interactions with students. Finalists in the search process will be asked to provide official transcripts. A background screening is required upon hire.
